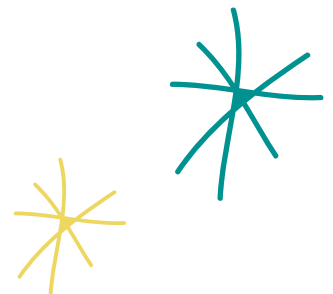




Infographic Steps

- Invite students to pick a topic to build their argument around
- Students submit proposals for approval
- Research window
- Cross check credibility of sources + finalize information to be featured in the infographic
- Explore different examples of infographics; students create parameters for final product (rubric elements)
- Explore digital tools for infographic creation (Canva, Piktochart, etc.)
- Prototype a template of the design and test the concept
- Design infographic
- Include hyperlinks to sources

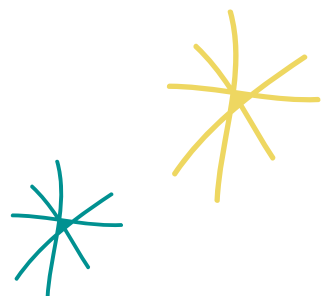
